



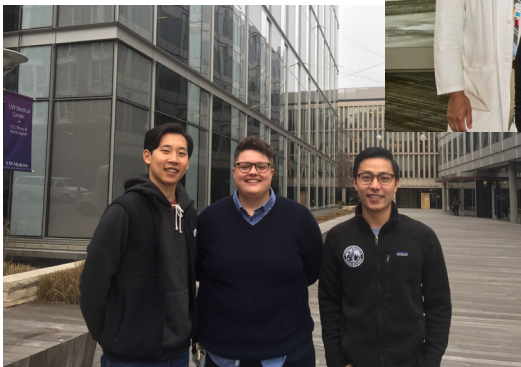

What's New in Patient Education?

The Model Systems Knowledge Translation Center (MSKTC) is recruiting individuals with burn injury and their partners to provide feedback on a consumer factsheet and video series on sexuality and intimacy after burn injury. To be eligible to participate, individuals must be 18 years of age or older and speak English. Phone interviews will last approximately 60 minutes. Participants will receive \$25 for their time.

UPDATE ON BMS RESEARCH ENROLLMENT

The NWRBMS team greatly appreciates our research participants. Your involvement helps us improve the lives of people with burn injury. At the conclusion of 2019, we exceeded our enrollment goals for each of our Burn Model System research studies:

Burn Model System National Database: 55 (4 of these individuals are kids and their parents)

Virtual Environment Home Rehabilitation: 31 adults

Genomic Predictors of Functional Outcomes after Burn Injury: 65 adults and 102 total from all sites

UW Partners with ANMC to Perform Needs Assessment and Factsheet Consumer Testing

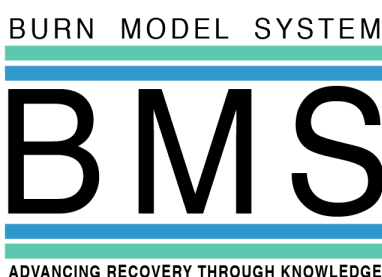

Electrical Cord Safety Tips:

- Never remove an extension cord's grounding pin in order to fit it into a two-prong outlet.
- Never use indoor extension cords outdoors.
- Avoid powering multiple appliances with one cord.
